Dean's Leadership Forum On Diversity

Diversity: An Idea Becomes an Ideal in

Central Pennsylvania and Beyond

The title of this year's symposium captures the essence of the message that is being sent throughout the country. No longer is the question whether we can afford to make diversity a part of our workplace culture, but rather whether we can afford not to cultivate a varied and diverse workforce. As commentators Judith Lindenberger and Marian Stoltz-Loike perceptively note: "The long-term success of any business calls for a diverse body of talent that can bring fresh ideas, perspectives and views to their work. The challenge that diversity poses, therefore, is enabling your managers to capitalize on the mixture of genders, cultural backgrounds, ages and lifestyles to respond to business opportunities more rapidly and creatively." Given economic realities in Central Pennsylvania and the nation as a whole, together with the need for progressive and innovative approaches to enhance productivity, proper attention to the diversity initiative is no longer merely an option. Several outstanding panels will address a wide range of issues that dramatically affect members of the bar, the corporate community, and the citizenry at large. Included among the panel discussions will be: the ways in which a diverse labor pool is a productive, and rapidly becoming indispensable, labor pool; the benefits of a coherent affirmative action program to achieve the desired diverse working environment; the legal pitfalls that should be avoided as corporate America responds to the growing need to meet its diversity objective; and an overview of the relevant laws, regulations and legal precedents that govern management's decision-making process in the development of its various employment policies and programs, both nationally and locally.

2010 Summer International Law Institutes

Widener University School of Law's summer institutes in Europe provide law students with the unique opportunity to build their own "Summer International Law Experience". Widener's programs in Lausanne, Switzerland and Venice, Italy have been designed with the student in mind. Each program consists of two 2-week segments and students have numerous options when enrolling in courses. Students can select from the following options:

- Students may select any one of the two week segments and spend 2 weeks in Europe studying international law and then return home for the rest of the summer.
- Students may select one two-week segment in Lausanne and one 2-week segment in Venice or take 2 segments in one location for a month long summer experience.
- Students may select the first two-week segment in Lausanne, spend the next 2 weeks traveling through Europe, and then select the last 2-week segment in Venice for a complete summer European experience.

The myriad of options available in our European Summer Law programs mean almost every student can build a personal program to meet the individual's educational, financial, and personal goals.

Lausanne

June 7-July 2, 2010

Students will enjoy the history and culture of Switzerland with a chance to meet students, faculty, and international civil servants from a variety of different cultures. This program offers international law classes, tours of various organizations such as World Health Organization. 1 credit courses in International Criminal Law, Global Health Law, International Human Rights, and International Investment Law. Tuition: \$825/credit



Venice

June 20-July 17, 2010

Students will immerse themselves in Venetian culture while studying international law topics which include European Union Law, Comparative Copyright Law, International Trade and the Environment Law. The program visits Venetian Courts. 1 credit courses focusing on Comparative and International Law. Tuition: \$825/credit



Sydney

June 13-July 16, 2010

Australia is a fascinating and diverse nation. Students will visit the "High Court" in Canberra and observe the Prime Minister and his cabinet. This program exposes students to Australian legal perspectives. 3 credit courses focusing on Comparative Family Law and Australian Legal Perspectives. Tuition: \$825/credit



Nairobi

June 13-July 16, 2010

Students can explore the cultural diversity of Kenya. This unique program immerses students in international legal problems while exposing them to wide differences in culture and perspective. 2 credit courses in International Criminal Law, Comparative Constitutional Law and International Environmental Law. Tuition: \$825/credit
