Heather Payne is an Associate Professor at Seton Hall University School of Law and an emerging leader in the areas of energy law, environmental law, and evolving regulatory policy. Prior to entering academia, she was Assistant Director of the Center for Climate, Energy, Environment and Economics (CE3) at the University of North Carolina School of Law. She also clerked for Judge Martha Geer on the North Carolina Court of Appeals, and worked as a chemical engineer and corporate executive.

Professor Payne holds a BChE in Chemical Engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology, and a J.D. from University of North Carolina School of Law, where she graduated with High Honors and served as a member of the North Carolina Law Review.

KeithWelks is Deputy Treasurer for Fiscal Operations for the Pennsylvania Treasury Department. He oversees the processing of more than 60 million Commonwealth payments each year to vendors, employees, grant recipients and beneficiaries. Mr. Welks led the creation of Treasury's Keystone Home Energy Loan Program (HELP), and is actively involved in efforts to develop a secondary market to support energy efficiency financing for residential improvements and to transform energy conservation at college campuses.

He is a 1975 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He created and served as the first chief of the Pennsylvania Environmental Crimes Section in the Office of Attorney General. Following that, he served as Chief Counsel of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.

The purpose of the conference is to discuss what legal approaches are best for Pennsylvania to significantly reduce its greenhouse gas emissions by 2050. The conference will bring together policy makers, stakeholders, and lawyers to discuss the most significant and promising legal options.

The conference will feature a variety of expert panelists and public officials engaging with attendees on:

- · The state of climate science, and what it means
- · Climate choices and bridging divides
- · Legal Pathways to Deep Decarbonization in the United States
- · The state of play in Pennsylvania

Attendees will hear from experts and dialogue about the best ways forward for Pennsylvania on electricity, transportation, energy efficiency, and a just transition. The event will conclude with a discussion about what lawyers should do to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

This conference is based on a book that was published in March, Legal Pathways to Deep Decarbonization in the United States (Environmental Law Institute, Michael B. Gerrard and John C. Dernbach eds.) The book details more than 1,000 legal tools for federal, state, local, and private decision makers to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by at least 80% by 2050.
