RE: New Environmental Law Certificate Requirements

The Environmental Law (EL) certificate is offered jointly by the Law & Government Institute and the Environmental Law & Sustainability Center. The faculty recently approved a revision to the certificate requirements developed by Professors Pappalardo, Pensley, and me. The new requirements will go into effect at the beginning of the Spring 2026 semester.

The new requirements create a similar structure for the EL certificate as the structure for the other three certificates offered by the Institute. This structure will allow EL certificate students to more easily pursue other certificates offered by the Institute while completing the necessary coursework, developing relevant experience, and receiving sufficient exposure to environmental law and policy to justify special recognition.

A chart comparing the old and new requirements is attached for your review. You may wish to consult it as you register for classes going forward. However, EL certificate students who have formally expressed their interest prior to the end of the Fall 2025 semester will be permitted to pursue their certificate under whichever set of requirements increases their ability to earn the certificate.
